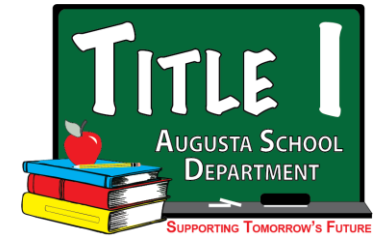

Parents/guardians play an important role in assisting their child's learning and are encouraged to be actively involved in their child's education. Title I wants your input with our consolidated application process and family involvement plan.

Communication

Title I staff will provide families with limited English proficiency, disabilities, and /or migratory children with information and student reports in a format the family understands. This includes alternative formats upon request and in a language families understand as required under section 1111 of the ESEA. In addition, we want to have families join us for our Title 1 events by providing transportation and child care when needed.

Parents/guardians will receive a phone call from their child's classroom teacher to discuss a referral to the Title I program. Upon acceptance in the Title I program, a letter along with copies of the Title I School/Parent/Student Compact and Family Involvement brochure will be sent home.

Parents/guardians have the right to decline Title I services for their child. In addition, if a child no longer qualifies for Title I services, based on student

assessments, the parent will be informed that services will end.

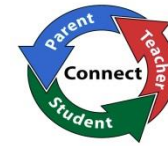


Fall Open House/Annual Meeting

Provides an opportunity for parents/guardians and teachers to discuss student progress toward meeting

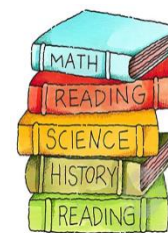
